Commander's Report

Really? A year in review already? But we are just into the 4th quarter...

Well, while that may be true, we are quickly nearing the end of our boating season and for many of us, our weekends are now consumed with college football and soon to be fall cleanup chores. We also are approaching our annual 2022 Change of Watch (in early November) so with all of that in mind, a year in review is in order starting from November of last year, 2021.

Our annual Change of Watch (2021) drew in a nice crowd. Members came to thank the club officers who had served the previous year and to welcome our new club officers for 2022. The event was held at Yacht Cove and the new officers were sworn in by District 26 Administrative Officer Marc Theriault, AP.

Soon after last year's Change of Watch, we were deep into the fall season and by then, most of us stowed our boats away for the upcoming winter. A few of us used that down time in late November to perform Day Marker maintenance around Lake Murray.

In December, nearly one hundred of our members gathered to enjoy some holiday cheer at our annual Christmas Party. The event was held at Yacht Cove and a nice time was had by all. We even had Santa attend our gathering this year and he shared with us his naughty and nice list.

As we got right into 2022, we dealt with a significant erosion issue on the Island causeway; which, for the safety of our members, required temporarily closing our driveway until the necessary repairs were made. It also led to rescheduling an ABC class set to be held during that period of time. Thanks to our partners at Dominion Energy and the hard work of several of our members, we reopened Flotilla Island as we entered into the month of March.

Not to be stopped, our quick thinking members overcame the causeway issue by planning a camping and boating weekend away from the island in early March and headed to Dreher Island State Park for a spring weekend of boating, camping, and fellowship. This was the first event of the year and drew a comfortable crowd. Also in March, we held our annual Oyster Roast, which was very well attended, followed by a New Member Orientation at Flotilla Island the following weekend.

We closed May with a Charleston to Beaufort, S.C., cruise where our members trailered their boats to the coast and set off for a multi-day event navigating the waters of the Intercostal Waterway (ICW).

June also proved to be a busy month. On the first Saturday in June, a nice size crowd gathered for a day trip cruising up Lake Murray to Clouds Creek where they were invited to a member's home for a wonderful meal followed by a late afternoon raft up.

Speaking of rafting up, our club had its first of two official "Log Jam" raft ups on 18 June where 39 boats and 97 members and friends gathered for this annual event. June also found several members providing safety and marker boats for the Columbia Sailing Club's Overnight Sailboat Race.

Safety Officer's Report

Running the Shallows

This time of year the leaves are turning and the many rivers and back waters of our lakes offer some fantastic views. Lake Murray has a number of rivers and creeks coming in providing areas to explore.

The Saluda River is the largest river and easiest to navigate if you follow some simple rules and have a depth sounder/chart plotter available. The plotter isn't necessary, but is more accurate than guessing or having one of the many commercial maps of the lake.

The lake levels will be dropping soon so a good sounder and plotter would do wonders extending your safe boating season. The "Garmin ECHOMAP Plus 43cv, 4.3-inch Sunlight-readable" is on Amazon now for \$264. It has features unheard of a few years ago and a great buy for the performance it offers. There also is the "Garmin 010-01550-00 Striker 4," which doesn't offer full charts but does have a mapping function with GPS and waypoint ability along with a depth sounder for only \$123.

A few things to keep in mind as you head up the rivers and shallow areas is you really don't want to be running too fast just in case the bottom comes up faster than you notice the change on your depth sounder. As the lake goes down many areas become very shallow.

While effort is made to put buoys out marking the shallows and shoals, the system isn't perfect. Some areas will be missed and others will have buoys blown away or run over. Your depth sounder will be your friend in those cases, along with a vigilant lookout by the captain.

As you go on up the rivers, the markers end. And as you get further up the rivers a different skill set will be needed. The depth sounder, while helpful, will not be able to fully predict the dynamics of the water flow and shallows. Think about the river dynamics just like driving a car on a winding mountain road. The car wants to go to the outside of the curve as you go around the turns. Water coursing down a river does the same thing.

You will see steep banks on the outside of the turns and gently sloping areas on the inside of the turns. The river is eating away the banks on the outside of the turn and depositing the soil and silt on the inside of the turn, making sandbars and shallow areas. The water near the outside of turns is nearly always deep and navigable (hopefully you caught the word "nearly" in this sentence). Any ripples, especially if they are shaped like a "V," will indicate a snag or rock just beneath the surface. Give it a wide berth and go slow.

Keep your camera ready. In a river you are in one of the few wild areas still available in this populated land. This time of year with the leaves falling on the water and the colorful tree lined banks its hard to find a prettier place.
