

OPERATING RULES FOR FLOTILLA ISLAND BY THE JOINT GOVERNING BOARD

1. Please care for and protect the building and grounds as you enjoy them.
2. Clean up after yourselves before terminating your activities. There is no janitorial service or trash pickup for the island. Therefore, it is imperative that you remove your own refuse and leave the building clean.
3. Do not leave open containers and items that may spoil in the refrigerator.
4. An adult member must accompany all guests and persons under eighteen years old. The latter must also be under the supervision of that sponsoring member.
5. When departing, please leave the building secure. Turn off all electrical power switches, except those marked to the contrary. If the docks were used, turn off the electricity at the breaker box at the end of the dock and turn off the water serving the dock. Whenever there is the possibility of freezing temperatures, the water must be turned off and all waterlines, including those on the docks, drained (see instructions posted inside broom closet and well house). Lock all doors and secure all windows.
6. Leaving one's boat and/or trailer unattended in the water or on the grounds over 72 hours is prohibited. This does not apply to any U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary designated rescue boat or to any boat provided through the Lake Murray Power Squadron for public use. Members wishing special consideration (Emergency waiver of this rule) must seek permission from the Joint Governing Board.
7. Please park courteously at all times in consideration of others.
8. The rule, DO NOT SWIM ALONE, applies to everyone using the island. Always ensure that at least one person is assigned as lifeguard.
9. Pets are not permitted in the building, but are allowed on the grounds. Please clean up after your pets.
10. The last member to exit the premises is responsible for locking the gate.
11. Members may reserve the building for private functions. Reservations must be made through the Commander or Commodore of their respective organization. Members using the Island for private functions are requested to make a donation to the treasury of their respective organization to help with heating/air conditioning costs.
